A PILGRIM'S WALK THROUGH THE NEW TESTAMENT 2 THESSALONIANS

Reading: 2 Thessalonians 1: 1-10

Introduction

- Story of the birth of the Thessalonian church recorded in [Acts 17].
- A church that was born and grew despite ongoing persecution/ affliction.
- The 2 Thessalonian letters have become the 13th/14th books of our NT.
- The over riding theme is the 2nd Coming of the Lord Jesus.
- 1 Thessalonians the believer and the 2nd coming.
- 2 Thessalonians the unbeliever and the 2nd coming.
- 1 Thessalonians 'will the Christian dead miss the 2nd coming?'
- 2 Thessalonians 'has the 2nd coming somehow already happened?'

1 Three Key New Testament Words

- Coming: 'parousia'.
- Revelation/Revealing: 'apokalupsis'.
- Appearing: 'epiphaneia'.
- NB. These words are used interchangeably to describe the same event.

2 The Second Coming And The Unbeliever

- Christ is coming personally, visibly and very publicly.
- The Christian dead will be resurrected. (the 1st resurrection).
- The living and resurrected Christians clothed with immortality.
- Then together '*raptured*' by the help of angels to meet the Lord in the air. [Matthew 24:30/31].
- Angels then return to earth for a 2nd purpose. [2Thessalonians 1:7/8].

3 The Falling Away

- Some were saying the Lord had already returned.
- Paul said that would not happen until certain things happened first.
- [2:3] A great '*falling away*' had to happen first.
- This took place with the '*Medieval church*'.
- Truth was replaced with superstition and God's words by men's words.
- Liberal Protestantism and the critical approach to the Bible and the supernatural explained away added to the '*falling away*'.
- This 'falling away' is still happening. [2Thess 2:15].

4 A Rebuilt Temple At Jerusalem?

- This fallacy is hung on the words of [2:3/4].
- The Jerusalem temple was the centrepiece of Jewish worship.
- It accommodated the sacrifice of animals for sin.
- When Jesus died as *'the Lamb of God'* no further need for animal sacrifice.
- The Jews rejected Christ's sacrifice and kept sacrificing animals.
- God allowed the temple to be destroyed to end their practise. [Hebrews 10:26].
- The word '*temple*' in [vs 4] is '*naos*' meaning the church.
- If Paul had meant the temple at Jerusalem he would have used Greek word '*hieron*.'
- It was in the '*church*' that the '*man of sin'* would arise.
- This happened with the rise of the dynasty of the bishops of Rome
- They have taken to themselves titles 'vicar (substitute) of the Son of God" Lord God, the pope' 'the Holy Father' etc.
- These things were still to be fulfilled in Paul's day.
- They have now been fulfilled.
- 'The Coming of the Lord draws nigh.'

QUALITIES OF A GOOD CHURCH

The Marks Of A Good Church Based On [1Thessalonians].

[1:7/8] A good example to other churches.

[1:8] God's undiluted Word going out far and wide.

[1:9] A congregation one and all *'serving'* the living and true God.

[2:13] A congregation that welcomed/embraced the Word of God. [3:6] Remembers the servants of the Lord.

[3:12] A church that abounds in love for one another. (Also 4:9)

[4:1] A church where the people's first priority is to 'please God.'

[4:3/4] A church walking in sanctification and is morally upright [5:6] A church that is watchful.

[5:11] A church that comforts and edifies one another.

[5:12] A church that respects the servants of the Lord among them.

[5:17] A church of prayer.

[5:19/20] A church that is 'Pentecostal'.

[5:25] A congregation that prays faithfully for the servants of God.
