

Reading: 1 Samuel 16:1 - 14

Introduction

- The Biblical stage of 1 Samuel is approx. 1000 years before Christ.
- So far we have seen all manner of characters come onto the stage.
- At last, in our reading, the lead character (David) makes his entrance.

1 Introduction To David

- David's name occurs 1139 times, 59 of which are in the new testament.
- David means, 'beloved of God.'
- He was one of the major celebrities of the whole Bible.
- The Lord Jesus descended from him.
- His father was 'Jesse' and he had at least 7 brothers and a sister named 'Zeruiah' [1 Samuel 26:6].
- The family home was in the town of Bethlehem located 5 miles south of Jerusalem.
- He is remembered as, 'the man after God's own heart.'

2 God Always Has His Man/Woman For The Hour

- He often has them concealed in the unlikeliest of places.
- Consider Moses, Saul of Tarshish, Martin Luther, William Tyndale, William Carey.
- God needs a king and he finds a boy minding sheep. [Consider Psalm 89:19 20].
- God often takes weak things to take on strong things. [Consider 1 Corinthians 1:26 29].

- Don't think 'God could never use you.'
- God's choice is often people just doing ordinary things. [Consider Psalm 78:70 71].
- Don't despise the day or the place of small things. That's where God finds His men/women.

3 How Does God Measure A Man/Woman?

- We measure/evaluate people in many various ways.
- But how does God measure a man or a woman?
- He measures them by the condition of 'their heart.'
- The heart refers too the emotions, the will, the intellect and our desires. [Proverbs 23:7].
- Consider the key text: [16:7] 'the Lord looks on the heart.'
- Consider strongly, [1 Samuel 13:14].
- Seven who looked impressive on the outside were refused and the least impressive was chosen.
- There are men with boy's hearts and boys with men's hearts.

4 God's Plan A

- · David was actually 8th choice or Plan H.
- But he was always God's Plan A.
- Notice how the word 'chosen' is used 3 times in [vs 8, 9 and 10].
- God is God and it is His right to choose how He pleases.
- He choose David but he did not chose Eliab or Abinadab.
- Hallelujah He chose you and He chose me. [John 15: 16].
- He chose Israel as His people and not the Philistines.
- He chose the sinful Saul of Tarshish but He did not chose to save Caiaphas or Pontius Pilate.
- [Romans 9] The Potter has power over the clay.
- Who are we to say, 'why have you made me thus?'
- God as supreme God can choose who he likes and He does.
- Give Him thanks that He has chosen you.
