Introduction

- A most serious situation confronts the armies of Israel.
- It is a challenge to God and the Kingdom of God on earth.
- God's will and rule is being challenged.
- David arrives at the battlefield and indicates he will fight Goliath.
- David's eldest brother Eliab judges David.

1 Eliab The Critic

- A critic is a 'fault finder' or a 'nitpicker'.
- A critic finds fault and expresses unfavourable opinions.
- They are basically a self-appointed judge of others.
- · Don't be a critic, be an encourager.

2 The Cause

- A cause is a good reason, motivation or principle for doing something.
- It is something you sow into.
- There are both good and bad/evil causes.
- Then there is the greatest cause the cause of God and heaven.
- When we stand before God His cause will be the only one that matters.

3 People Who Realised There Is A Cause

- Moses: the cause of liberating Israel from the slavery of Egypt.
- Nehemiah: the cause of rebuilding Jerusalem's walls despite the opposition of the critics.
- Dietrich Bonhoffer: the cause of the 'Confessing Church' in Hitler's Germany.
- Corrie Ten Boone: the cause of hiding the Jews from the Nazis.
- William Tyndale: the cause of a Bible in English to fuel the Reformation.

4 The Cost Of The Cause

- There is often a price to pay for the cause.
- Ask Bonhoffer or Tyndale or Corrie Ten Boone.
- But the greatest cause was the redemption of fallen humanity. No greater cause.
- Consider the price Christ paid for that cause.
- But in every case the cost was worth it.

NB. Jesus was able to say, 'It is finished'.

Concerning His cause - you've got to finish what you start.
